RE: STIP APPLICATION FUNDING REQUEST WITH ALBERTA TRANSPORTATION FOR BRIDGE FILES 74837,75922, 80831

ISSUE:

Council authorization is required for Reeve to sign STIP funding grant application letters for 3 structures.

BACKGROUND:

- Local Road Bridge Program is one of 4 provincial funding streams of the Strategic Transportation Infrastructure Program (STIP). It provides funding to municipalities for local bridge projects, including engineering, maintenance, rehabilitation, and replacement.
- STIP Program for Local Road Bridge Program contributes a maximum of 75% of submitted costs or actual costs, whichever is less.
- County performs annual inspections on bridge structures with cycles of 57 months or less per structure
 - Through the annual inspections, County has identified 3 structures that have low rating advisories and require repairs or replacement.
- **BF 74837 SW-8-59-4-W5** is a culvert constructed in 1957.
 - Condition is very poor and poses a risk due to plates separating, failed longitudinal seam and deep pitting along culvert floor and side walls.
 - o Identified in the 10-year Capital Plan as a culvert replacement in 2027 with engineering to take place in 2026.
- BF 75922 NW-27-56-1-W5 is a culvert constructed in 1964.
 - Condition is very poor and poses a risk due to heavy corrosion and pitting in the side walls and flooring and separation of seams
 - o Identified in the 10-year Capital Plan as a culvert replacement in 2027 with engineering to take place in 2026.
- **BF 80831 NE-6-58-3-W5** is a culvert constructed in 1970.
 - Condition is very poor and is a risk due to longitudinal cracking/shearing on strut walers due to loading as well as missing struts and increasing roof sag.
 - o Identified in the 10-year Capital Plan as a bridge repair in 2027 with engineering to take place in 2026.

ANALYSIS:

 Bridge funding applications are required before funding can be made available through the STIP program Estimates were provided by MPA Engineering including engineering and construction costs.

- Council's authorization is required for the Reeve to sign application letters for the bridge funding through the STIP program.
- Administration will obtain Council approval to proceed with a project once the County has been notified regarding the status of the STIP grant application.

RE: BRWC – ALBERTA COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP (ACP) GRANT APPLICATION

ISSUE:

Council is being asked to support the Town of Barrhead's submission of an Alberta Community Partnership (ACP) Grant for a Regional Raw Water Supply Assessment Study – Phase 2 project on behalf of Barrhead Regional Water Commission (BRWC).

BACKGROUND:

- ACP grant is a provincial program with a mandate to improve the viability and long-term sustainability of local governments by providing support for regional collaboration and capacity building initiatives.
- July 2011 BRWC received approval by Order in Council to be established as a water commission with a mandate to "provide potable water through the operation of a water treatment and transmission system" with water being drawn from the Paddle River.
- BRWC members include:
 - County of Barrhead Reeve Munck & Councillor Chapman are the current elected representatives
 - o Town of Barrhead Councillors Smith & Oswald are the current elected representatives
- September 19, 2023 County Council supported in principle, submission of a 2023/24 ACP grant application by the Town of Barrhead on behalf of BRWC for up to \$200,000 for a Regional Water Supply Assessment Study project.
 - Grant application was successful and funds have been expended on eligible projects in 2024 & 2025.
- November 25, 2025 Town of Barrhead Council passed a resolution to submit, as managing partner for BRWC, a non-matching 2025/26 ACP grant application in support of the Regional Raw Water Supply Assessment Study – Phase 2 project.
 - Town of Barrhead will be responsible for managing the grant and related compliance requirements.
- November 28, 2025 deadline for the ACP Grant administered by Municipal Affairs.

ANALYSIS:

- 2023/24 ACP Phase 1 non-matching grant outcomes were:
 - BRWC 2026 Business Plan;
 - o Paddle River Weir North Bank Erosion Protection Report;

- Alternate Raw Water Source Analysis;
- Water Supply System Assessment Sludge Survey; and
- o Preliminary Technical Engineered Report to review and update capital cost estimates.
- 2025/26 ACP grant application builds on the work undertaken in the successful 2019/20 & 2023/24
 ACP application to complete the following tasks:
 - o Complete a water meter vault upgrade assessment report
 - Complete a condition analysis of the raw water valves chamber and develop conceptual replacement and upgrade design and cost options
 - Conduct an analysis of potential potable water production expansion
 - Complete a condition analysis of the raw water reservoir aeration system and develop conceptual upgrade design and cost options and recommendations
 - Complete a condition analysis of the raw water reservoir cells 1 and 2, and berm and develop conceptual upgrade design and cost options and recommendations
 - Complete updates to the 5-year capital plan
- Application is for \$200,000 and requires no matching municipal funds.
 - Any provincial grant funding received will financially benefit the utility account holders for both the County and the Town.

STRATEGIC ALIGNMENT:

Providing support for the submission of the ACP grant application on behalf of the BRWC aligns with the County Strategic Plan in the following area.
